Milwaukee, Wisconsin – May 2004...At their May meeting of 2004, the Faye McBeath Foundation Trustees awarded grants totaling \$236,200, it was announced today by Charles A. Krause, Chairman. Grants will fund projects in the Foundation's five priority areas: welfare of children, health, health education, the elderly, and civic and governmental affairs. Grants were made to the following organizations:

Agape Community Center, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$10,000 to support construction of a new playground for neighborhood children

AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$15,000 for an HIV-specialty dental clinic

Aurora Family Service, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$25,000 for the Nurturing Elders group education program

Badger Association of the Blind and Visually Impaired, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$15,000 to support vision rehabilitation services for seniors

COA Youth and Family Centers, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$31,200 over two years to support the salary of a part-time coordinator for Camps for Kids

Community Memorial Foundation, Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin - \$10,000 for operating support for the Community Outreach Health Clinic, plus a \$5,000 challenge grant

Donors Forum of Wisconsin, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$10,000 to support an organizational sustainability task force to study and recommend options to advance the association's mission with a more stable funding structure

Milwaukee Catalyst, Inc., Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$15,000 for operating support

Milwaukee Public Theatre, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$25,000 to support the development of *In the Moment* training DVD and manual for dementia caregiver trainers/educators

Task Force on Family Violence, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$20,000 for the Children's Advocacy Program

Walker's Point Youth and Family Center, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - \$30,000 to strengthen volunteer services for runaway and homeless youth

Wheelchair Recycling Program, Madison, Wisconsin - \$20,000 to support the expansion of the Milwaukee program supplying wheelchairs and other equipment to the needy, and \$5,000 for the purchase and installation of a computerized inventory program

The Faye McBeath Foundation was established in 1964 by Miss McBeath, niece of Lucius Nieman, founder of The Milwaukee Journal. Since its founding, the Foundation has awarded in excess of \$30 million to nonprofit organizations, principally in the four-county metro Milwaukee area. By 2014, the Foundation will have dispersed all of its assets, as directed by Miss McBeath.
